Whales and the Arctic ecosystem

Whales are classified according to two groups:

1) Toothed whales

 \rightarrow they have teeth!

2) Baleen whales

→ they do not have teeth, but filters known as 'baleen plates'


Why are whales important?

- Ecosystem management
 - \rightarrow THEY EAT FISH AND OTHER SMALLER ANIMALS
 - \rightarrow A blue whale can eat up to 40 million krill per day

They contribute to **the functioning of the entire ecosystem**.

As big marine mammals they **help regulate ecosystem balance** in the oceans.

Whales are considered to be among the **most intelligent animals**.









Whales in popular culture






Contemporary challenges
